## The Fairways

Thousands of golfers from around the world who visit the kingdom agree: Thailand is the "Golf Capital of Asia."

hoever came up with the idea of hitting a ball with a club in as few strokes as possible could never have imagined the popularity and passion this sport currently generates. Golf has grown from an old-fashioned pastime into a multimillion international sport industry. While the sport may be scarred with recent scandals, there is still a growing desire among many to give it a try.

Particularly in Thailand, interest in golf -- both as a sport and as a business -- is growing. On average, 400,000 foreign golfers come to the kingdom annually to play its more than 200 courses. In fact, it has turned into a huge part of the tourism industry, bringing in an estimated Bt8 million yearly. Recent proof of Thailand's popularity among golfers: the country has recently been honored to host the "Royal Trophy-Europe vs. Asia Golf Championship" in Chonburi.

Bangkok itself boasts more than 20 golf courses, the majority of which can be considered of international standard. With such a number to choose from, you might want to consider enjoying some of the world's most spectacular golf courses while you are on vacation or simply taking time off from a business trip. There are also several companies offering excursions and interesting packages for families and groups.

One of the most popular golf courses is the Thana City Golf & Country Club just off the Bangna-Trad Highway, only half an hour from Bangkok. Opened in 1993, Thana City's landscape is enhanced by natural streams and sand, which almost creates the illusion of a seaside course. The 18-hole championship golf course was designed by Greg Norman to test the keenest golfer. Several professional tournaments, including the 1993 Thailand Men's Open and the 1994 and 1995 Kosaido Thailand Ladies

Open, have been played on this course; it also hosted the final round of the Johnnie Walker Super Tour 1996. If you don't want to wander too far away from the big city, then you might want to consider the Bangkok Golf Club. Located within Bangkok's suburbs, it is a mere 30-minute drive from the city, or 20 minutes from Suvarnabhumi International Airport. On offer are cleverly designed yet extremely testing fairways and greens. Price of entry is Bt1,600 on weekdays and Bt2,400 on weekends. Caddies are available for hire at Bt250 at all times. The Pinehurst Golf Club, one of the five top-ranking luxury golf clubs in Thailand, provides a truly international experience. Pinehurst's 27-hole course features many water hazards, and rolling hills dominate its landscape. Price of entry is Bt1,700 on weekdays and Bt2,300 on weekends. Dozens of championship-standard courses in and around Bangkok also offer a wonderful time on the fairways. These include the Rajpruek Club (Tel: 02 955-0055), Kantarat Golf Course (Tel: 02 534-3840/3), Krungthep Kreetha Sports Club (Tel: 02 379-3717), Panya Indra Gold Club (Tel: 02 943-0000/10), The Legacy Golf Club (Tel: 02 914-1930/4), Unico Grande Golf Course (Tel: 02 379-3752), and Windsor Park & Golf Club (Tel: 02 989-4200/1). The provinces of Pathum Thani, Nakhon Pathom, and Chachoengsao as well as nearby Pattaya, Chonburi, and Rayong -- also host a number of world-class golf courses, including Pleasant Valley Golf & Country Club (Tel: 038 260-825/6).

One of the newest golf and sports resorts is Pattana Golf & Sports Resort, which opened in December 2004. Located in the heart of the business areas of Chonburi and Rayong, Pattana Golf & Sports Resort offers twenty-seven holes of international standard golf courses, split into three nine-hole stretches. Undulating fairways, scenic mountain ridges, palm trees, and large water hazards await golfers looking for unforgettable rounds of the game. One of the most interesting is the Royal Chiang Mai Golf Club (Tel: 053 849-301), which is a half-hour drive from the town proper.
